Climbing Ropes Instructions & Guidelines

Before using Iron Edge Climbing Ropes

- » Rope climbing is dangerous and requires safety precautions.
- » Iron Edge recommends seeking professional assistance to install Climbing Ropes.
- » Crash mats must be used underneath as a safety precaution. Consult your insurance provider for liability information.
- » If using 'Slings' to hang the Climbing Rope from a beam or object, ensure there are no abrasive edges that could potentially wear the sling prematurely.
- » Check the product for any manufacturing defects prior to use. If defects are evident, do not use the product and contact Iron Edge immediately.
- » Iron Edge will not be held responsible for any injury or death that occurs while using this product.
- » The rope is not suitable for outdoor use.

Product care

- » Inspect the Climbing Rope for damage before each use. Discontinue use if damage is evident.
- » The rope should not be left outside in the elements.
- » If the rope becomes wet or is exposed to moisture, it needs to be thoroughly dried to avoid damage to the rope.
- » If the rope is left wet, it will cause the rope to rot and it must be discarded.

Twelve-month Product Warranty

- » **Climbing Ropes are covered by a twelve-month warranty for manufacturers' defects and faults.**
- » **Iron Edge will exchange/replace/refund to the customers' satisfaction all Climbing Ropes affected by manufacturers defects.**
- » **This warranty does not include normal wear and tear.**
- » **Warranty is void if the rope is used outdoors and affected by moisture.**
